

### DOORS OPEN LAMBTON COUNTY June 21 & 22, 2014







## SARNIA & POINT EDWARD

1 Enbridge Sarnia Solar Farm, 5115 Blackwell Side Road, Sarnia, Ontario

Comprised of over 1.3 million solar panels, when it opened, Enbridge's Sarnia Solar Farm was the largest solar energy facility in the world. With 80 mega-watt of output, the farm generates enough energy to power over 12,000 homes. Guided tours of the solar farm and a free barbecue lunch will be offered. Come and learn more about solar power generation.

**2** City of Sarnia Water Pollution Control Centre, 333 Saint Andrew Street, Sarnia, Ontario The City of Sarnia Water Pollution Control Centre is a Conventional Sewage Treatment facility. Come for a guided tour that will show how raw sewage entering the facility is cleaned for the water to be released back into the river. There will also be a small demonstration of the biological bacteria used to treat the sewage. Saturday 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.; Sunday 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

### **3** Lawrence House Centre for the Arts,

127 Christina Street South, Sarnia, Ontario Lumber baron, William Lawrence, built this Queen Anne style house in 1892 for \$30,000. In 1977, the house was donated to the City and Suncor contributed towards the renovations for the building's use as a centre for the arts. As such, we host art exhibits and sales, concerts, writers meetings, First Friday and other special events which lend to an exciting atmosphere for local arts. During Doors Open, visitors can view our "Midsummer Art" exhibition and sale and enjoy refreshments served by volunteers in Victorian Dress! Music and entertainment will be offered as well as tours and heritage information.

**4** Judith & Norman Alix Art Gallery, 147 Lochiel Street, Sarnia, Ontario

One of downtown Sarnia's most historically and socially significant buildings, this beautiful structure was built in 1893 by local photographer Major John Strathearn Thom to accommodate his photography studio and was transformed in 2012 into the Judith & Norman Alix Art Gallery. On June 21 stop in for a community BBQ

and learn about our video art exchange project, "Under New

### **(5)** The Front Door, 216 Front Street, Sarnia, Ontario

This building has been through many reincarnations over the years, most recently being renovated into The Front Door restaurant with a glass garage door on the front façade. Overlooking the Sarnia Bay, the patio views are a key feature. Come and enjoy live music on the patio, historical photographs, and food sourced from all over Lambton County that will be available for purchase.

**6** Ups N' Downs, 226 Front Street North, Sarnia, Ontario

Originally designed as a two-story commercial building with two upstairs apartments, Ups N' Downs opened in 1979 in what was once Guys Pool Hall. This historic pub has become a popular Sarnia institution. View the building's supporting steel beams created locally at the Doherty Stove Works on the façade of the pub, and view historical photos and memorabilia of Sarnia which decorate the walls.

**7** St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, 261 Christina Street

North, Sarnia, Ontario The original church was built in 1841, and the current building opened on July 1, 1867. Canada's second Prime Minister, Alexander Mackenzie, worked as a brick layer before his political career and helped to build the church. Mackenzie was buried from this building. Have a guided tour of the church, view photographs and artefacts of the church and Alexander Mackenzie, and enjoy complimentary

refreshments.

### (8) All Saints Anglican Church, 248 Vidal Street North, Sarnia, Ontario

In 1834, missionaries held Anglican services in local homes. In 1848, a red brick building named St. Paul's was completed on London Road. The contractor was Alexander Mackenzie, later the second Prime Minister of Canada. In 1883, the cornerstone for St. George's Church was laid. In 2011 the amalgamated Parish of All Saints' was formed at this location. Come and view this historic church.

Sarnia, Ontario Mrs. Maud Hanna was a founding member and president of the Sarnia & District Horticultural Society who bequeathed her garden to the society after her death in 1946. Since 1920, the SDHS has maintained the garden year-round. The garden is a recognized historical site and a winner of the 2010 Community Excellence award from National Communities in Bloom. Stroll the garden and view photographs, period costumed animators, and enjoy

**10** Mulberry House, 197 London Road, Sarnia, Ontario

This home was built in 1867, reputedly by Alexander Mackenzie, and received its name from the mulberry bushes on the property. Also known as the "Saddy House" as Mayor Marceil Saddy lived there for many years. The home features bargeboard gables, original doors, floors, ceiling beams, and three fireplaces. Come to receive a tour of this heritage designated home.

**11** Strangway Community Centre, 260 East Street North, Sarnia, Ontario

The Strangway Community Centre is celebrating its 25th anniversary in 2014. ### 12 St. Paul's Anglican Church,

210 Michigan Avenue, Point Edward, Ontario From 1868 to 1902, this church stood at the corner of Livingston and Victoria streets, where the tall tin steeple reflected light from the Fort Gratiot Lighthouse. The building was moved to its present location in 1902. Tour the heritage room, which showcases many historical artifacts relating to the maritime and railway history of Point Edward. Saturday: 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.; Sunday: 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.; Sunday service at 10 a.m. (all are welcome)

(B) The Cheese Store, 510 Michigan Avenue, Point Edward, Ontario

Before the Cheese Store opened in 2011 the site was a gas station and garage for many years. The only remaining original part of the building is Point Variety. There will be a display from the Sarnia Heritage Committee on the history of cheesemakers, samples from Lambton's only local cheesemaker - Great Lakes Goat Dairy in Wyoming, and guided tours of the facility.

(1) Christ Church, Anglican, 20 Main Street South, Forest, Ontario


Christ Church, Anglican was the first church in Forest. The stained glass windows were created by renowned artisan Christopher Wallis and the needlepoint of the chancel kneeling board, hidden until two years ago, was done in England. View exhibits of antique silver and old photos, read a history book on the church, and enjoy complimentary sweets and beverages.

(15) Kiwanis Kineto Theatre, 24 King Street West,

Forest, Ontario The Kiwanis Kineto Theatre is one of the oldest continually running independent movie theatres in the world. In 1917 the Rumford brothers purchased the property and converted the building into Forest's first movie theatre. In 1977 the Kiwanis Club

purchased the theatre and have recently converted it to use digital projection equipment. Come and view a display celebrating the history of the theatre and film in Forest.



**16** Forest-Lambton Museum, 8 Main Street North, Lower, Forest, Ontario This building opened as a bake shop in 1880 and became a Forest institution. The Forest-Lambton Museum moved into the building in 2009. Enjoy this year's exhibit featuring brides' dresses from the past to the present, including a World War II era dress worn by a local bride. Come and learn more about Forest and local bridal fashions throughout the decades. Saturday 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.; Sunday 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

17 Royal Canadian Legion Branch No. 176, 58 Albert Street, Forest, Ontario Thirty-two ex-servicemen from the First World War felt that the spirit of comradeship should be continued. So, this branch of the Legion was established in 1930. The Legion continues to support its members and the community through the annual poppy campaign, as well as public speaking and poster contests. During Doors Open, visitors can view a display of war memorabilia. 🌞

**29** The Fitzgerald Rig at The Petrolia Discovery, 4301 Discovery Line,

Petrolia, Ontario The Fitzgerald Rig, built in 1903, is the largest pumping rig in the world and is credited with keeping the oil industry alive in Petrolia after the oil boom. Refurbished by the Petrolia Discovery Foundation in 2013, it continues pumping oil today. Join in the official Fitzgerald Rig Celebration on Saturday from 1-3pm, and on The Fitzgerald Rig at The Petrolia Discovery Sunday from 1-3pm enjoy a Victorian Tea and tour the gardens. ## Petrolia, Ontario

Van Tuyl & Fairbank is believed to be the oldest independent hardware store in Ontario. Established in 1865 by J.H. Fairbank, it has passed through three generations and is presently owned and operated by Charles Fairbank III. The store supplies local industries, farmers, and those who operate the 700 heritage wells in the Petrolia area. Visitors will experience guided tours of the store and view oil well parts used since the 19th century.

**31** Victoria Hall, 411 Greenfield Street, Petrolia, Ontario

www.town.petrolia.on.ca Victoria Hall was built in the Queen Anne style in 1889 by architect George F. Durand. It originally housed municipal offices, a police station, a fire hall, and an opera house. The building was restored after a fire in 1989. Victoria Hall still houses municipal offices and the Victoria Playhouse Petrolia theatre. Come for a tour of this national historic site and municipally designated heritage building.

**32** Lancey Hall, 429 Ella Street, Petrolia, Ontario unique daguerreotypes throughout the home. Saturday 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.; Sunday 1 p.m. to 4 p.m.

26 Watford/Warwick Museum, 515 Ontario Street, Watford, Ontario

This building was built in 1885 as the Watford Fire Hall. This hall was unique in that a jail cell was added after the turn of the century. The building was converted into the museum in 2012. See the MaxMobile, a car made by hand by David Maxwell in 1900, and a 1936 Ford Bickle Fire Truck. Come and learn more about the history of Watford and Warwick Township.
